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|        | Visit the <u>State Department</u> travel website and review up-to-date Country Specific Information for your destination. Look for any <b>Travel Warnings</b> (long-term situations affecting safety or stability) or <b>Travel Alerts</b> (short-term conditions) to your planned destination or areas of through travel.   |
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|        | From State Department Country Specific Information, obtain up-to-date information on visa requirements.  |
|        | Register your trip with the <a href="State Department Smart Traveler Enrollment Program">State Department Smart Traveler Enrollment Program</a> <ul> <li>Receive up-to-date information about the country you are traveling to</li> <li>Automatically receive important updates including travel warnings and alerts</li> <li>Assistance available in case of emergency</li> </ul> |
|        | Find the location of the nearest US Embassy/Consulate in your destination country: <u>Directory of all US Embassies abroad</u>   |
|        | Go to <u>State Department Travel Tips</u> for more recommendations on planning a safe trip.  |
|        | Obtain Travel Insurance Prior to Departure Should include: Evacuation, Repatriation, Emergency Medical Expenses (with specified deductible), and may also include trip cancellation/luggage loss. Rates vary from \$80 - \$180 for a thirty day period.  |
