Messaging tips

Three "As" of Advocacy

Awareness: Learning the Political Landscape

• Do your homework! Learn the issue and your audience

Advancement: Coalition and Relationship Building

- Learn who else is working on the issue, and partner up!
- Maintain contact, even after the initial interaction

Action: Communication and Message Delivery

- Clear, concise, "sound bites"
- Limit to 2-3 most important points

Key Messaging Tips

- Focus on emotional, values-driven arguments.
- Tell stories with images and feelings.
- Avoid jargon and too much data.
- You hold weight as a child health expert, so speak to what you know!!

Key Frames in Gun Violence Prevention discussion

- The serious personal toll that gun violence takes on Americans' lives
- The people's right to be free from violence in their communities
- The changing nature of weapons toward more powerful, military-style firearms that make us less safe
