

- Ill-informed constituents (ill timed, Supreme Court nomination)

## Legislative Overview





### Federal, State and Local

#### Federal legislature

- 425 Representatives, 100 Senators
- D.C. offices and district offices

#### State legislatures

- Different rules for every state number of members, time in session
- Offices in state capital and home district
- Many have "day jobs"

#### Local legislatures

- City councils
- Wards small area, big expertise





# Legislators vs....









## Reaching a Legislator is Difficult!

#### Members of Congress

- •Half of all Americans have contacted their Congressman or Senators
- •Hundreds of calls per day monthly average per office?
- •6,000 communications
- •Dozens of **meetings** per day daily average per office?
- •13
- Same number of staff since 1975
- •Most Members of Congress work 6 days per week, 10-12 hours per day
- •Average Age of a Legislative Assistant in the House of Representatives 27 years old



### Know Your Legislator

- •Why is this important?
- Need to understand their position on your issue
- Need to understand their level of involvement
- Need to understand their ability to influence
- Need to understand who you're meeting with and how they fit into the hierarchy





#### **Personal Visits**

#### Legislative Office or District Office

- Request a meeting
  - ✓Be flexible on timing
  - ✓ Explain your purpose
  - √Confirm in writing
- The meeting
  - ✓Importance of staff meetings
    ✓27-year-old LAs
  - ✓Send a follow-up thank you letter or e-mail

#### **Town Hall Meeting**

- Attend local events
- Ask question/raise issues





## Tips for Interacting with Legislators





#### The Dos and Don'ts of Meetings

### Before the Meeting

- ✓Know your Member (research ahead of time)
- ✓ Review issues/Talking Points

### Be Prepared

- ✓Importance of staff
- ✓ Keep it brief
- ✓ Meeting chaos: When 15 minutes turns into 5



### During the Meeting

- Be Punctual
- Keep it brief
- Stay on Message
- Don't Argue
- Don't Have to Be an Expert

- Make the Ask
- Listen
- Leave-behind Materials
- Thank Member or Staff






## The Elevator Speech

- Telling your story
- Importance of sharing your unique perspective as succinctly as possible
- Have your 30-second speech ready because you never know how much time you'll get!
