Economic Assistance

TANF: Temporary Assistance for Needy Families ("welfare")

Eligibility:

- Be pregnant or responsible for a child under 19 years of age
- Have low or very low income
- Be either under-employed, unemployed, or about to become unemployed

How to apply:

• Through state's Department of Human Services

Programs:

- Cash assistance, job training, childcare, transportation, earned income tax credits (EITC)
- Promotion of two-parent families and prevention of unplanned pregnancies

Food Assistance

WIC: Women, Infant, Children

Eligibility:

- Be pregnant, new mother, infant, or child < 5 years of age
- Have medical or nutritional need
- Meet income requirements (< 185% FPL) or enrollment in approved program (TANF, SNAP, Medicaid, DC Healthy Families)

How to apply:

- Complete the national pre-screening tool: http://wic.fns.usda.gov/wps/pages/start.jsf
- Then make appointment at local WIC clinic (find sites through DOH)

Programs:

- Food packages determined by age, breastfeeding status
- Farmers Market Nutrition Program
- Breastfeeding support

SNAP: Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (Food Stamps)

Eligibility:

- \bullet Gross monthly income < 130% FPL, or up to 200+% FPL if other conditions apply How to apply:
 - Through local Department of Human Services
